

Acts 15:36-16:5



³⁶ And after some days Paul said to Barnabas, "Let us return and visit the brothers in every city where we proclaimed the word of the Lord, and see how they are." ³⁷ Now Barnabas wanted to take with them John

called Mark. ³⁸ But Paul thought best not to take with them one who had withdrawn from them in Pamphylia and had not gone with them to the work. ³⁹ And there arose a sharp disagreement, so that they separated from each other. Barnabas took Mark with him and sailed away to Cyprus, ⁴⁰ but Paul chose Silas and departed, having been commended by the brothers to the grace of the Lord. ⁴¹ And he went through Syria and Cilicia, strengthening the churches.

16 Paul came also to Derbe and to Lystra. A disciple was there, named Timothy, the son of a Jewish woman who was a believer, but his father was a Greek. ²He was well spoken of by the brothers at Lystra and Iconium. ³Paul wanted Timothy to accompany him, and he took him and circumcised him because of the Jews who were in those places, for they all knew that his father was a Greek. ⁴As they went on their way through the cities, they delivered to them for observance the decisions that had been reached by the apostles and elders who were in Jerusalem. ⁵So the churches were strengthened in the faith, and they increased in numbers daily.

How flexible should we be?

1) Let's not be thrown by disagreement

Disagreement doesn't always mean disunity

and God can still use it for good

2) Let's be flexible and inflexible for the gospel

3) ...because healthy doctrine enables growth

Coffee Questions:

Are we tempted to be thrown by disagreements in the church? How does this passage help?

This passage teaches us to be as rigid as stone in guarding the gospel and as flexible as a reed when getting the gospel out. What might it look like to do each of these in our situation?

Healthy doctrine produces healthy churches which enable God's mission to advance. In what ways can we be cooperating with this process?
