### "Get out of my sight" 2 Kings 23:31 – 25:30



24 <sup>10</sup> At that time the servants of Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came up to Jerusalem, and the city was besieged. <sup>11</sup> And Nebuchadnezzar

king of Babylon came to the city while his servants were besieging it, <sup>12</sup> and Jehoiachin the king of Judah gave himself up to the king of Babylon, himself and his mother and his servants and his officials and his palace officials. The king of Babylon took him

prisoner in the eighth year of his reign 13 and carried off all the treasures of the house of the LORD and the treasures of the king's house, and cut in pieces all the vessels of gold in the temple of the LORD, which Solomon king of Israel had made, as the LORD had foretold. <sup>14</sup> He carried away all Jerusalem and all the officials and all the mighty men of valor, 10,000 captives, and all the craftsmen and the smiths. None remained, except the poorest people of the land. 15 And he carried away Jehoiachin to Babylon. The king's mother, the king's wives, his officials, and the chief men of the land he took into captivity from Jerusalem to Babylon. 16 And the king of Babylon brought captive to Babylon all the

men of valor, 7,000, and the craftsmen and the metal workers, 1,000, all of them strong and fit for war. <sup>17</sup> And the king of Babylon made Mattaniah, Jehoiachin's uncle, king in his place, and changed his name to Zedekiah.

<sup>18</sup> Zedekiah was twenty-one years old when he became king, and he reigned eleven years in Jerusalem. His mother's name was Hamutal the daughter of Jeremiah of Libnah. <sup>19</sup> And he did what was evil in the sight of the LORD, according to all that Jehoiakim had done. <sup>20</sup> For because of the anger of the LORD it came to the point in Jerusalem and Judah that he cast them out from his presence.

### In the end, God tells sinful people to "get out of my sight"

"Surely this came upon Judah at the command of the LORD, to remove them out of his sight, for the sins of Manasseh, according to all that he had done, and also for the innocent blood that he had shed. For he filled Jerusalem with innocent blood, and the LORD would not pardon." (24:3-4)

"For because of the anger of the LORD it came to the point in Jerusalem and Judah that he cast them out from his presence." (24:20)

"And then will I declare to them, I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness." (Matthew 7:23)



### All that was glorious is stripped away



Gedaliah

#### Her salvation

God brought them out of Egypt (1 Kings 8:9, 16, 21, 51; 2 Kings 17:7, 36) But now they return to Egypt (23:34; 25:26)

#### Her temple

Solomon received gold from the nations and gold filled the temple (1 Kings 6-7; 10:14-15)
But since then the temple has been ransacked for gold seven times (1 Kings 14:26; 15:18; 2 Kings 12:17-18; 14:13-14; 16:7-8; 18:14-16; 24:13-14)

### But in 2 Kings it wasn't quite the end...

"Hezekiah [was] the father of Manasseh, and Manasseh the father of Amos, and Amos the father of Josiah, and Josiah the father of Jechoniah and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon...

... And after the deportation to Babylon: Jechoniah was the father of Shealtiel, and Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel, and Zerubbabel the father of Abiud, and Abiud the father of Eliakim, and Eliakim the father of Azor, and Azor the father of Zadok, and Zadok the father of Achim, and Achim the father of Eliud, and Eliud the father of Eleazar, and Eleazar the father of Matthan, and Matthan the father of Jacob, and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called Christ." (Matthew 1:10-16)
