Exodus 20:14

Just as St Nicholas didn't invent Christmas, so St Valentine didn't invent romance

(Genesis 2:18-24 cf. Matthew 19:4-6)

- God intended it between one man and one women
- God intended it to be powerful and permanent
- God intended it as the foundation of family

Marriage is a God-given picture of our relationship with God

(Isaiah 62:5; Hosea 2:14-20; Ephesians 5:52-33; 2 Corinthians 11:2; Revelation 19:6-9)

God forbids whatever undermines or threatens his beautiful pattern for sex only within marriage

- Adultery (e.g. Exodus 20:14)
- Divorce (Deuteronomy 24:1-4 cf. Matthew 5:31-32; 19:3-9)
- Fornication (e.g. Deuteronomy 22:13-21; 1 Corinthians 6:18-20; 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8)
- Homosexuality (e.g. Leviticus 18:22; Romans 1:26-37)
- Prostitution (e.g. Deuteronomy 22:20-21)
- Polygamy (e.g. 1 Timothy 3:2)
- Incest (e.g. Leviticus 18:8-19)
- Bestiality (e.g. Exodus 22:19; Leviticus 18:23; 20:15-16)
- Pornography (e.g. Matthew 5:27-30)

Jesus calls us to turn from sexual sin; if we do, we can be cleansed, sanctified, justified. (1 Corinthians 6:9-11)
