Introduction: "Too many vegetables on the plate, brother"

- and so this week: a list of 12 names!

Historical names – Luke records actual history about actual people.

- cf. Bauckham, Jesus and the eye-witnesses

Revolutionary names – Jesus replaces failed leaders with his own choices.

- it's significant that there are 12 of them (cf. Acts 1:17 "numbered")
- like the 12 tribes of Israel (cf. Exodus 24:4)
- replacing the leaders of the 12 tribes of Israel (Luke 22:30)

Foundational names – these men are Jesus' authorised representatives.

- Acts 1:1-2; Ephesians 2:20; 2 Peter 3:1-2
