

1 Corinthians 9:1-14



¹ Am I not free? Am I not an apostle? Have I not seen Jesus our Lord? Are not you my workmanship in the Lord? ² If to others I am not an apostle, at least I am to you, for you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord.

³ This is my defense to those who would examine me. ⁴ Do we not have the right to eat and drink? ⁵ Do we not have the right to take along a believing wife, as do the other apostles and the brothers of the Lord and Cephas? ⁶ Or is it only Barnabas and I who have no right to refrain from working for a living? ⁷ Who serves as a soldier at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard without eating any of its fruit? Or who tends a flock without getting some of the milk?

⁸ Do I say these things on human authority? Does not the Law say the same? ⁹ For it is written in the Law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it treads out the grain." Is it for oxen that God is concerned? ¹⁰ Does he not certainly speak for our sake? It was written for our sake, because the plowman should plow in hope and the thresher thresh in hope of sharing in the crop. ¹¹ If we have sown spiritual things among you, is it too much if we reap material things from you? ¹² If others share this rightful claim on you, do not we even more? Nevertheless, we have not made use of this right, but we endure anything rather than put an obstacle in the way of the gospel of Christ.

¹³ Do you not know that those who are employed in the temple service get their food from the temple, and those who serve at the altar share in the sacrificial offerings? ¹⁴ In the same way, the Lord commanded that those who proclaim the gospel should get their living by the gospel.

The apostle Paul was being dishonoured by some in Corinth (4:2; 2 Corinthians 10:10) and he wants us to know...

1) Christian workers have a right to be paid

- a) common sense says so (v7)
- b) the Law of Moses says so (vv8-12)
cf. Deuteronomy 25:4
- c) the tithe for the Levites says so (v13)
cf. Numbers 18:21
- d) Jesus says so
cf. Luke 10:7

APPLICATION

We should honour Christian workers by supporting them generously.

Perhaps beginning with 10% of our income? (In the Old Testament the tithe was the mandatory starting point, with voluntary "freewill offerings" on top of that, see e.g. Exodus 35:5, 21-29)

2) Christian workers should be willing to waive their right to be paid, so as to present the gospel for free (v12b, v15, v18)

God's grace is free.

Jesus paid a great cost to save us, but for us there is no charge

Christian workers should imitate Paul as he imitated Christ (11:1)

APPLICATION

If you are here as someone investigating Christianity, we don't want your money!

If you are a Christian worker, don't pursue selfish gain.

DISCUSSION STARTER: Have you understood that the gospel is for free? Are you nonetheless motivated to give financially to gospel work?
