**Isaiah 55:2** (First bit!)

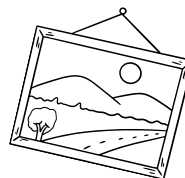
The Lord is using picture language!

*gives life*

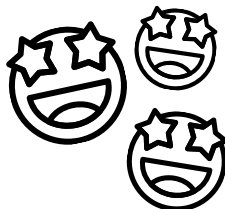
How good is it then to come listening to the Lord? **Circle.**
